They are on track to have delivered 270k to 280k grants




But...application numbers are still rising and waiting times still 15 weeks

Prospects for 2024

When looking at the data it is important to note that not all applications result in a grant. This table shows that there is a natural attrition of about 4%. The shortfall is over and above that natural attrition.

Probate

Inquiry

The Probate Registry has been experiencing significant delays. There are wider concerns about how effectively beneficiaries, executors and the bereaved are supported through the process and protected from rogue traders. The inquiry will take evidence on capacity, resources and delays across the probate service, and the impact of digitisation and centralisation, including the effectiveness of the online probate portal. The inquiry is interested in people's experiences of applying for probate including how the administration of probate could be improved for people who are already coming to terms with the loss of a loved one.

Likely timelines for the inquiry and key points

Our submission went in by the deadline on Monday.

All submissions will be collated, and a selection published. We will put a link to the published report on our website.

There will then be a hearing in Parliament, which we will attend as observers.

We stressed the importance of the Probate system to our members, the impact of the delays, the fact that we needed current progress to be maintained, and that increasing death rates would mean that more investment would be required in future.
